Southern Seas 2024 Overview

USS Sampson (DDG 102) joined USS George Washington (CVN 73), USS Porter (DDG 78) and USNS John Lenthall (T-AO-189) in the U.S. Southern Command area of responsibility for Southern Seas 2024. Engagements were carried out with partner maritime forces from Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Ecuador, Peru and Uruguay. Southern Seas 2024 enhanced capability, improved interoperability, and strengthened maritime partnerships with countries throughout the region through joint, multinational and interagency exchanges and cooperation.

2022 Deployment

USS Sampson (DDG 102) returned to Naval Station Everett, Aug. 11, 2022, following a seven-month deployment during which the crew conducted independent operations in and around the South China Sea, provided humanitarian aid to tsunami-damaged Tonga, and assisted in recovery/salvage of the downed F-35C Lightning II from the aircraft carrier USS Carl Vinson (CVN 70). Sampson also participated in multiple combined exercises including ship anti-submarine warfare readiness and effective measuring, Maritime Partnership Exercise 2022, Maritime Counter Special Operations Forces Exercise, several East China Sea patrols, a Taiwan Strait Transit and exercise Rim of the Pacific (RIMPAC) 2022.
